ADAPTATION TO LOSS

BIOLOGICAL

Hippocampus and septum
Parasympathetic
Hypothalamic-pituitary-adrenal axis (HPA)
↑ cortisone secretion
↓ immune system activity

PSYCHOLOGICAL

Shock / Conservation-withdrawal syndrome / disaster syndrome
Acceptance that it has occurred
Sadness, Grief
Wrenching, wounding of heart
Weeping, sobbing
New meanings
Hope for future
"It was an excruciating pain, a severe crushing agony, as if

my heart was rent in two. It was like a blow to the heart, a severe

wound, bruising, my heart was bleeding, leaving a pain."

Yielding, surrendering

Social support, comfort, sympathy

Ceremonies

Turning to new loves

USES OF GRIEF

A. SHOCK

- 1. Less likely to be attacked
- 2. Stimulate predators to release grip
- 3. Scooping
- 4. Refinding

B. SADNESS, GRIEF

- 1. Evoke support without need to collapse
- 2 Healing of psychological wounds
- 3. Adaptation

Ovid - "It is a relief to weep; grief is satisfied.."

Tears soothe the inner pain of sorrow and grief allows through crossing the river of tears both renunciation and renewal of love.
